Our March presentation was turning a Thin Stemmed Goblet by Alex Garcia. He spoke of turning from several wood sources. He cautions that if you use a branch or small tree that you should offset your stem to avoid the weak pith. He also demonstrated moving his entire body to maintain stable tool contact with the wood. He also demonstrated taking all of his cuts on the end of the stem toward the headstock to minimize pressure on the delicate stem. He also emphasized the importance of sharp tools.









Damage Control Plugs

Basically, the plugs are all truncated cones with the large diameter on one end connected to the small diameter on the other end with a straight taper.
